MON, SEP 10 - NEW YORK/ACROSS THE ATLANTIC

Depart New York on board your overnight transatlantic jet flight. En route enjoy dinner followed by a full-length movie.

TUE, SEP 11 - ARRIVE GLASGOW

Arrive in "Bonnie" Scotland today. Your tour of the breathtaking Highlands begins! Upon arrival, transfer to your hotel in Glasgow, Scotland's largest city founded by St. Mungo in AD550. The balance of the day is at leisure.

WED, SEP 12 - GLASGOW/STIRLING/OBAN

Depart Glasgow this morning for the town of Stirling. Visit Stirling Castle and its lovely gardens. It was home to most of the King Jameses. The castle looks down upon Bannockburn, Scotland's proudest battleground where, in 1314, Robert the Bruce secured Scotland's independence when he defeated the English. See the Church of the Holy Rude where John Knox preached, and the Erskine Monument. Follow the shore of Loch Lomond to Oban, a seaport on the firth of Lorn. (B,D)

THU, SEP 13 - OBAN - IONA - OBAN

Today you take the ferry from Oban to the Isle of Mull, then on to the Isle of Iona, where many Scottish kings lie buried. St. Columba and his disciples landed here from Ireland in 563AD and established Scotland's first Christian monastic settlement, resulting in the extension of Christianity throughout Scotland and Europe. Today it serves primarily as a religious retreat center. Visit Iona Abbey and return to the mainland and Oban for the night.

FRI, SEP 14 - OBAN/ISLE OF SKYE/FT. WILLIAM

This morning follow the shores of lovely Loch Linnhe to Glen Coe, site of the notorious 1692 massacre of the McDonald clan by the Campbells. Continue on to Mallaig where you board a ferry to Armadale Pier on the Inner Hebridean Isle of Skye. Visit the Clan Donald Center with its magnificent park

and hear about 13 centuries of clan history. Drive back over the Skye Bridge and then on to Fort William, in the shadow of Ben Nevis, Britain's highest mountain.

SAT, SEP 15 - FT, WILLIAM/INVERNESS

Continue north this morning past Invergarry to Loch Ness. As you skirt the banks of the loch, be sure to watch out for "Nessie", the mysterious Loch Ness monster. Then drive to Inverness, at the northern end of the Great Glen, long known as the capital of the Highlands. (B,D)

SUN, SEP 16 - INVERNESS

Enjoy a leisurely day in the beautiful Scottish Highlands. (B)

MON, SEP 17 - INVERNESS/BALMORAL/ ST. ANDREWS/EDINBURGH

Depart Inverness for Balmoral. Visit Balmoral Castle, the Queen's residence during hunting season. Continue on to Braemar, site of the royal Highland Games. Travel south to historic St. Andrews, named after Scotland's Patron Saint. It was in St. Andrews that Wishart, the Reformation preacher and companion of John Knox was martyred, and where John Knox preached and was imprisoned. See the ruins of the cathedral and the castle. St. Andrews is where golf is reputed to have begun. The Royal and Ancient golf Club, founded in 1754, has given us the rules of golf. End today in Edinburgh.

TUE, SEP 18 - EDINBURGH

This morning you set out to see Edinburgh, Princes Street and the Royal Mile with the Scott Monument. We begin with a visit to St. Giles Cathedral, where John Knox preached and where the Queen of England worships when in Edinburgh. History comes alive as you tour the mighty Edinburgh Castle. See Greyfriars Church and the Grass Market. The afternoon will be free to shop and explore Princes Street. (B)

WED, SEP 19 - EDINBURGH/NEW YORK

Your adventure is over as you transfer to the airport in time for your flight back to New York, arriving the same day.
