**Monday July 20, 2020**

**Isaiah 44:6-8**

<sup>6</sup>Thus says the LORD, the King of Israel,  
and his Redeemer, the LORD of hosts:

I am the first and I am the last;  
besides me there is no god.

<sup>7</sup>Who is like me? Let them proclaim it,  
let them declare and set it forth before me.

Who has announced from of old the things to come?

Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning.

<sup>8</sup> To you, O LORD, I cried,  
and to the LORD I made supplication:  
<sup>9</sup> “What profit is there in my death,  
if I go down to the Pit?  
Will the dust praise you?  
Will it tell of your faithfulness?  
<sup>10</sup> Hear, O LORD, and be gracious to me!  
O LORD, be my helper!”  
<sup>11</sup> You have turned my mourning into dancing;  
you have taken off my sackcloth  
and clothed me with joy,  
<sup>12</sup> so that my soul may praise you and not be silent.  
O LORD my God, I will give thanks to you forever.

<sup>13</sup>For great is your love toward me;  
you have delivered me from the pit of death.

<sup>14</sup>The arrogant rise up against me, O God, and a band  
of violent people seeks my life;  
they have not set you before their eyes.

<sup>15</sup>But you, O Lord, are gracious and full of compassion,  
slow to anger, and full of kindness and truth.

<sup>16</sup>Turn to me and have mercy on me;  
give your strength to your servant, and save the  
child of your handmaid.

<sup>17</sup>Show me a sign of your favor, so that those who hate  
me may see it and be put to  
shame; because you, LORD, have helped me and  
comforted me.

**Psalm 31**

a strong fortress to save me.

<sup>4</sup> take me out of the net that is hidden for me,  
for you are my refuge.

<sup>5</sup> Into your hand I commit my spirit;  
you have redeemed me, O LORD, faithful God.

<sup>6</sup> You hate<sup>[a]</sup> those who pay regard to worthless idols,  
but I trust in the LORD.

<sup>7</sup> I will exult and rejoice in your steadfast love,  
because you have seen my affliction;  
you have taken heed of my adversities,

<sup>8</sup> and have not delivered me into the hand of the enemy;  
you have set my feet in a broad place.

<sup>9</sup> Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress;  
my eye wastes away from grief,  
my soul and body also.

<sup>10</sup> For my life is spent with sorrow,  
and my years with sighing;  
my strength fails because of my misery,<sup>[b]</sup>  
and my bones waste away.

<sup>11</sup> I am the scorn of all my adversaries,  
a horror<sup>[c]</sup> to my neighbors,  
an object of dread to my acquaintances;  
those who see me in the street flee from me.

<sup>12</sup> I have passed out of mind like one who is dead;  
I have become like a broken vessel.

<sup>13</sup> For I hear the whispering of many—  
terror all around!—  
as they scheme together against me,  
as they plot to take my life.

<sup>14</sup> But I trust in you, O LORD;  
I say, “You are my God.”

**Prayer:** God of strength; in the midst of my trouble, O Lord, I turn to You. In the midst of human pride and arrogance, I humble myself before You. I ask Lord, that You be a sure and certain “Rock” within my life. Anchor me as only You can with complete trust and faith that You would always be by my side. In Jesus’ name we pray these things. Amen.

**Friday July 24, 2020**

### **Romans 8:12-25**

<sup>12</sup>So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—<sup>13</sup>for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. <sup>14</sup>For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. <sup>15</sup>For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, “Abba! Father!” <sup>16</sup>it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, <sup>17</sup>and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

<sup>18</sup>I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. <sup>19</sup>For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; <sup>20</sup>for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope <sup>21</sup>that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. <sup>22</sup>We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; <sup>23</sup>and not only the creation, but we ourselves,

who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. <sup>24</sup>For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? <sup>25</sup>But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

**Prayer:** Steadfast Lord, we confess that we are sinful beings and constantly in debt for the grace, mercy, and love that You show upon us, yet You are gracious and full of compassion, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. Share these same qualities to us O Lord. When we are too quick to judge impart wisdom to be gracious. When we are too quick to seek retribution, remind us of Your great compassion. When the world creates in us anger or hostility, instill in us a sense of Your purpose that we be slow to anger. When it feels as though we need to “strike back” against our enemies, inspire us to a place of steadfast love. Amen.

<sup>14</sup> But I trust in you, O LORD;

persecutors.

<sup>16</sup> Let your face shine upon your servant;  
save me in your steadfast love.

<sup>17</sup> Do not let me be put to shame, O LORD,  
for I call on you;  
let the wicked be put to shame;  
let them go dumbfounded to Sheol.

<sup>18</sup> Let the lying lips be stilled  
that speak insolently against the righteous  
with pride and contempt.

<sup>19</sup> O how abundant is your goodness  
that you have laid up for those who fear you,  
and accomplished for those who take refuge in you,  
in the sight of everyone!

<sup>20</sup> In the shelter of your presence you hide them  
from human plots;  
you hold them safe under your shelter  
from contentious tongues.

<sup>21</sup> Blessed be the LORD,  
for he has wondrously shown his steadfast love to me  
when I was beset as a city under siege.

<sup>22</sup> I had said in my alarm,  
“I am driven far from your sight.”  
But you heard my supplications  
when I cried out to you for help.

<sup>23</sup> Love the LORD, all you his saints.  
The LORD preserves the faithful,  
but abundantly repays the one who acts haughtily.

<sup>24</sup> Be strong, and let your heart take courage,  
all you who wait for the LORD.

**Prayer:** God of harvest, Indeed Your abundant goodness showers the world with Your blessings and we are able to find shelter from the stormy seas in Your presence. You have heard our supplications when we have cried out to You for help and our very lives reflect the strength, courage, and blessings that You freely offer. Allow our hearts to take courage and be strong as we sense Your presence dwelling among us. In Jesus' name we pray these things. Amen.

**Sunday July 26, 2020**

**Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43**

<sup>24</sup>[Jesus] put before [the crowds] another parable: "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to someone who sowed good seed in his field;<sup>25</sup> but while everybody was asleep, an enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and then went away.<sup>26</sup> So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared as well.<sup>27</sup> And the slaves of the householder came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?'<sup>28</sup> He

answered, 'An enemy has done this.' The slaves said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' <sup>29</sup>But he replied, 'No; for in gathering the weeds you would uproot the wheat along with them. <sup>30</sup>Let both of them grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Collect the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.' "

<sup>36</sup>Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples approached him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." <sup>37</sup>He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man; <sup>38</sup>the field is the world, and the good seed are the children of the kingdom; the weeds are the children of the evil one, <sup>39</sup>and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. <sup>40</sup>Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. <sup>41</sup>The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will collect out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, <sup>42</sup>and they will throw them into the furnace of fire, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. <sup>43</sup>Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Let anyone with ears listen!"

**Prayer:** Faithful God, most merciful judge, You care for Your children with firmness and compassion. By Your Spirit nurture us who live in Your kingdom, that we may be rooted in the way of Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.
