REFLECTION FOR THURSDAY, OCTOBER 22, 2020:

Greetings and peace to you my friends!

Just a quick note to share with you that I will not be writing a devotion to you today!

Having just come back from a wonderfully relaxing and renewing vacation this week has been a great challenge for me. You know what I mean... Vacation felt like I was moving 5mph but a return to sharing ministry with everyone this week required 500mph. A good many people within our community of faith are sick. We've had a family who is suffering from having been forced to leave their home for an extended period of time because of a fire. A brother within our community of faith has been told that his job has been eliminated. Another brother of our is being placed on hospice. A sister in Christ of ours is in the hospital not yet understanding what is wrong with her. In addition to my normal responsibilities, these are but a few of the prayers that I have been lifting up to our Lord. 500mph.

So... In thinking about what topic to share with you today in a theological reflection... I simply do not have time to stop and share a thought. 500mph!

Oh, another thing I am noticing a great deal of... Well... not sure what it's called... so I'll just call it **COVID CRUD!**



Here's my thought. I don't know about you, but I sure am tired of this whole Covid virus! I am tired of hearing about it! I am tired of the restrictions that have been imposed by this virus that I can't even see. I am tired of trying to figure out all the various pieces of medical advice being offered by both doctors and broadcasters. It truly is fatiguing! While I'm thinking about it, I'm tired of hearing about the number of people getting sick from Covid and I'm tired of hearing the reality that so many people, including people we know, have or are dying from Covid! In fact, I am not just tired of COVID. I am frustrated with COVID. I am angry with COVID! I want to fight COVID! I want to destroy COVID!!! I want to annihilate COVID!!! But how do I fight, destroy, annihilate COVID? It just does not listen to my reasoning and it avoids any punches that I may throw.

So, in some ways, my frustration, my anger, my desire to hurt COVID... well all those negative feelings... come out in my relationships with people who can't avoid listening to my reasoning, who can't avoid my path. Sometimes, these negative emotions come out with the people around me. People I love who in a

moment frustrate me. People who I like who use different reasoning than I do and come to different conclusions than me!

Are you feeling me? I'm coining this feeling **COVID CRUD!** We can't take our negative feelings out on COVID... but we can release these negative feelings out into the world.

Welcome to COVID CRUD!

It's not writing my weekly devotion because well... I'm feeling overwhelmed with the number of tragedies that I'm witnessing in the world. It's me "snapping" at the person next to me in line at the grocery store because he decided to pull his mask down to talk on a cell phone. COVID CRUD!

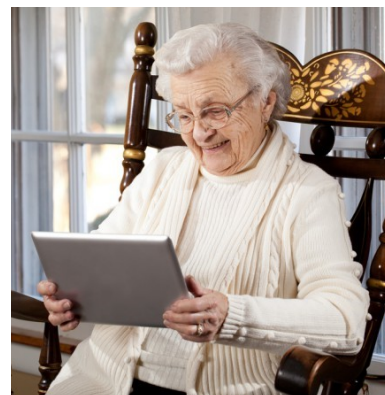


### **VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITY**

### GOD'S WORK OUR HANDS



**God's work. Our hands.** **Mat Ministry - SOS!!** We need many more hands to turn the plastic bags we've collected into plarn for those who are crocheting mats. The process is quite easy - take each bag, smooth it out lengthwise, fold it several times upon itself until you have a narrow strip, cut off the handles at the top (making sure to cut off any curved edges), cut off the seam at the bottom, fold the strip in half and cut at the folded edge, fold again in half and cut again at the folded edge. You should now have 4 strips that can be fastened together by looping the ends of the strips over each other and pulling gently to keep the knot as small as possible. Keep knotting strips together until they can be rolled up into a ball. Please save your plastic scraps and any bags that were not usable and bring them and your balls of plarn to the back porch of Light of Christ. You will see where to put them.
